*All recycling materials
should be set out in front
of house on the mornings
designated below:*

Bottle/Can Pickup: 2nd/4th Mon AM, **13&27 AUG**

Includes: glass jars/bottles, aluminum cans, tin (steel) cans, plastic small mouth containers with #1 or #2 on the bottom, empty aerosol cans.

Procedure: Rinse bottles and cans; discard caps.
Place in blue plastic bags.

Paper Pickup: 2nd/4th Friday AM, **10 & 24 AUG**

Includes: newspapers, magazines, phone books, ad mail, cardboard/boxes, mixed paper, scrap paper.

Procedure: Place paper in paper bag or cardboard box or tie with string.

Other Notes: General trash pickup occurs every Tuesday and Friday mornings.
