## Safety Tips

Most homes are burglarized during the day when the majority of neighbors are at work or school. Protect your home. Trim bushes around doors and windows. Install a deadbolt lock that requires a key to open on the inside. Don't leave the key in the door if there is a window on the door or in its vicinity. Keep your windows closed and locked when you are away. Hang blinds or curtains and keep them closed, so would-be burglars can't see what kinds of valuables you have in your house. Have an alarm installed. It can save you money in the long run if it prevents a burglary. It will also lower your homeowner's insurance premium.

## Fliers Illegal

According to city law, it is illegal for businesses to place fliers and similar advertising material on cars or at homes. If you find advertising material on your vehicles or residential property (stuck in doors), you can call 311.

A Sanitation Enforcement Officer will come to your home, pick up the flyer and issue a citation to the business.

### Recycling (Zone 4) Pickup & Procedures

All recycling materials should be set out in front of the house on the mornings designated below:

#### Bottle/Can Pickup: 2nd/4th Mon AM, 9 & 24 JUL

Includes: glass jars/bottles, aluminum cans, tin (steel) cans, plastic small mouth containers with #1 or #2 on the bottom, empty aerosol cans.

Procedure: Rinse bottles and cans; discard caps. Place in blue plastic bags.

#### Paper Pickup: 2nd/4th Friday AM, 14 & 28 JUN

Includes: newspapers, magazines, phone books, ad mail, cardboard/boxes, mixed paper, scrap paper.

Procedure: Place paper in paper bag or cardboard box or tie with string.

**Other Notes:** General trash pickup occurs every Tuesday and Friday mornings.
